## What is the asthma project?

Your doctor's surgery is taking part in an asthma audit. An audit is a review or check to see how well something is working. This audit looks at how your doctors and nurses look after you and treat your asthma. The aim of the audit is to find out how to make asthma care better, and to make sure it gets better for everyone.

## How does the asthma project work?

The information about your asthma will be taken from the computers your doctors and nurses use. You won't have to do anything extra. The project will look at:

- > how the doctor tests your asthma
- > what medicine you take
- > how the doctors and nurses look after you.

## What happens next?

- 1 Our team will write a report about the answers.
- 2 We won't use your name, birthday or where you live in the report. Nobody will know there is information about you.
- 3 Doctors and nurses will find out how well they look after people like you.

You are helping doctors look after children with asthma by being part of this project – thank you for joining in.
